SCHOOL CLOSING - DELAYED OPENING

A delayed opening of schools will be instituted in some cases of inclement weather. Classes at all levels will commence at 10:00 A.M. on a delayed opening day.

Radio stations in the metropolitan area (WOR, WINS, WCBS, WVNJ, WABC) will announce school closings and delayed openings beginning about 6:30 A.M. Information on local school closings or delayed openings can also be obtained by calling 288-1848.

Parents are urged to use the local telephone number and listen to radio announcements. Please do not phone the Police Department for closing information.

ATTENDANCE

Regularity of attendance and punctuality are important from the first day in Kindergarten. They are essential requirements for a child's steady progress throughout his or her life.

The Hasbrouck Heights Board of Education recognizes the following as legitimate reasons for school absence: physical or emotional illness, serious illness or death within the immediate family, remedial health treatments, observance of religious holidays and required attendance at court.

The parents of students in grades K-8 who have more than 10 days of occasional absences will be required to confer with the principal or guidance counselor. Secondary students and parents are urged to become familiar with the attendance policy at the Jr.-Sr. High School to determine the relationship of school absences with the loss of course credit and graduation.

When students are absent, a written excuse from home must be brought to school on the day of return. Parents of elementary students are requested to inform the school each morning that their child will be absent. The principal or his/her designee will call the home of each absent child if no call relative to the absence has been received by the school.

HOME INSTRUCTION

Home instruction is provided by the Board of Education for students who because of illness must be absent from school for extended periods of time. Arrangements for such instruction can be made after consultation with the principal of the school.

REPORTING TO PARENTS

Report cards are issued four times per year (see calendar for specific dates.)

Parent/Teacher conferences are conducted once a year. Parents will be contacted and appointments scheduled. Evening conferences will be announced.

Parents are always welcome and are urged to come to scnool to consult with the principal and teachers regarding their child's progress. Parents are asked to call the school and make an appointment in advance of their visit.

SCHOOL HEALTH SERVICES

The Hasbrouck Heights School System is pleased to continue an ambitious Health Screening Program. The purpose is to identify potential health problems. Information or concerns should be shared with the school nurse. All communication will be held in strict confidence.

All new students and those in 3rd, 7th and 10th grade are required to have a physical examination. All athletes and cheerleaders are required to have a physical examination yearly for participation in the activity of their choice.

Heights, weights, vision screening are provided at all grade levels. Audiometric screening is also provided at lst, 4th, 8th and 10th grade and as the need arises. Scoliosis screening is provided in 5th - 12th grades.

Nurses or other designated personnel will administer first aid in cases of injury. Parents are notified if injury is serious.

State guidelines for T.B. screening require that students from out of county, out of state or in certain towns/grades in New Jersey be Mantoux tested.

All newly hired employees must be Mantoux (T.B) tested and have a physical examination.

Immunization against Measles, Mumps and Rubella vaccination must have been administered after the first birthday. In cases of Chicken Pox, or other similar diseases, the students must remain at home until lesions are healed and dry.

According to Board Policy the administration of prescribed medication to a student during school hours will be permitted only when failure to take such medication would jeopardize the health of the student or the student would not be able to attend school if the medicine was not made available during school hours. Nurses will provide necessary forms for physician and parent documentation. Medication may be administered by the school nurse or parent (guardian) **ONLY**.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Children who cannot attend regular classes in the public school may attend a special class or special school which provides for their individual needs. Arrangements for such instruction may be made after consultation with the principal of the individual school.

KINDERGARTEN ENTRANCE

To be admitted to kindergarten, a child must be five years of age by October 1st of the current year.

Registration of kindergarten children is held in the spring with the late registration on the day school opens in September. Parents of each entering student must present a copy of the child's birth certificate, the record of contagious diseases, and dates of vaccination, innoculations, and immunizations. D.P.T. and polio vaccinations must be given after the child's fourth birthday. A physical and dental examination is also necessary. Immunization must be presented before or on the first day of school. Those not in compliance will not be able to attend until the regulations are met.

COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMINATIONS

Applications for these exams are available from the Guidance Office and should be filed six weeks prior to the test date. The school code for Hasbrouck Heights High School is 310510.

OBJECTIVES OF THE NATIONAL CONGRESS OF PARENTS AND TEACHERS

INSURANCE

The Board of Education provides an insurance policy for all children in kindergarten through grade twelve. This policy covers pupils while in school and on the way to and from school.

WORKING PAPERS

Anyone under eighteen years of age will require working papers for all types of jobs. Working papers are issued through the school. The prospective employer must fill out a form telling the kind of work the student will be doing and the number of hours he will be working. The student must also be examined by the school doctor. If the medical examination is satisfactory, the school issues the papers.

Working papers may be secured from the secretary in the guidance office of the high school from 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. while school is in session and from 9:00 A.M. and 3:00 P.M. during July and August.
