# Hasbrouck Heights/Teterboro Get New Fire Chief

During the 2005 Reorganization Meeting on January 1, 2005, Joseph Taylor, Jr. was sworn in as the new Fire Chief of the Hasbrouck Heights Fire Department for the first year

of his two-year term. The Fire Department also serves the Borough of Teterboro.

Chief Taylor will oversee a volunteer department of 54 men and women who operate

two engine companies, ladder company, rescue company and ambulance squad.

In 2004, the department responded to 500 fire and emergency calls and 1,090 ambulance calls.

During a fire emergency, the Fire Department performs many activities simultaneously under the Fire Chief's command — equipment is de-

ployed, rescue teams search the home/business, hoses are connected, activated and brought in to attack the fire from the inside, ladder compa-

# VFW Post 4591 Celebrates 50th

In 1954, James Falbo, Joseph Midlar, approached by Phil D'Amico and John and members -- of which three are still living. Muriel Stark of the Garfield VFW Post to start a VFW in Hasbrouck Heights.

They contacted many Veterans: The first meeting was held in Joseph and Helen Lagatutta's home with subsequent meetings being held at the Reformed Church. As the membership increased, they met at the Municipal Building and the Pioneer Club.

The Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4591 was chartered January 8, 1955 with 163 men as charter members -- of which nine are still living.

The Ladies Auxiliary was also chartered Joseph Lagatutta and Edward Neikirk were on January 8, 1955 with 51 women charter

When chartered, VFW Post 4591 was the largest Post installed in New Jersey.

The original charter installation was held at the Corpus Christi Annex Building.

Four years later plans were started to build their own Post Building and in September 1961 the Post was dedicated.

Kathy Dunn sang at the building dedication.

Joe was the first commander and his wife, Helen, was the first president of the

nies vent as needed, "F.A.S.T. Teams" are on standby to assist trapped firefighters, EMS is on standby, support personnel are ready (help change air tanks, get tools, etc.), equipment and personnel from other communities are positioned at the fire house to respond to other emergencies, etc.

The ability to mobilize the equipment and personnel in short response time, and to activate these resources in an efficient manner to serve our community during such an emergency, represents hours of training in the department.

The Fire Chief's non-emergency duties include: department daily administration (records, purchase orders, budgets, etc.), personnel, equipment maintenance, on-going department training, etc.

The Chief presides over department meetings, organizes

drills and conducts the annual inspection of Department members and apparatus.

He is involved in pre-planning for emergencies at target buildings such as the Hilton, trussed roof structures and hazards such as the railroad, Teterboro manufacturing facilities and the airport.

Along with Captain James Halloran, the Chief works with Teterboro's regional postal facility's management to prepare for a possible anthrax incident.

Chief Taylor works with Fire Prevention officials during Fire Safety Week.

The Chief coordinates Fire Department operations at special events such as the Easter Egg Hunt, Memorial Day and Chamber Holiday Parades, Memorial weekend 24-hour bicycle marathon, Rau-Fitzgerald Memorial 5k Run/one mile walk, Mason's 5k Walk for

Dyslexic Children, Town Day and the Department's annual Santa Ride Around Town.

The Chief represents the Fire Department at the Mayor and Council meetings, and with other borough officials.

He also represents the Hasbrouck Heights Fire Department at mutual aid official functions in other communities.

Chief Taylor's plans for his term include: first and foremost to protect life and property and to make sure no one gets hurt and that everyone is safe.

Second is to square away the new fire house, and third is to consolidate the three fire companies into one department so that there are one set of administrative rules.

He stated, "As we settle into our new fire house, my goal this year is to make the Fire Department more efficient, with accountability and better re-

sponse time to serve the communities of Hasbrouck Heights and Teterboro."

Taylor's career began in 1986 when, as a senior in Hasbrouck Heights High School and walking home after school along The Boulevard, he watched a Hamilton Avenue house fire. Two weeks later he joined the Department.

He started as a probationary fireman and over ten years trained in Firefighter One, Two and Three courses.

Firefighter One and Two pertain to basic and intermediate fire fighting, and Three to Tactics.

He has formal training as an EMT, HAZMAT technician and a heavy rescue technician.

In 1996 he started as an EMT for the City of Hackensack (emergency services) and previously was an EMT with Ambu-Aide in Hasbrouck Heights (nonemergency transport services).

Fire Chiefs work their way up the chain of command. As a member of Engine Company #1, Taylor was elected by the company for the position of 2nd Assistant Chief.

Two years later the Department members elected him as 1st Assistant Chief and then as Fire Chief. Fire Chiefs generally serve two-year terms.

Taylor was born in Hackensack Hospital and spent his childhood in Hasbrouck Heights. Two of his grandparents and dad also grew up in Hasbrouck Heights.

Taylor is married to the former Colleen Kelley and has a three year old son, Jason. He and his family live in Hasbrouck Heights on Hasbrouck Avenue. ###

# **Kiss Goodbye**

was fondly called by the Fire Department, is going to Nutley.

The "Kiss" had been the third home to the Hasbrouck Heights Fire Department.

After the "Big Fire" on December 10, 1999, the Department wintered at Kundert Motors on Terrace Avenue.

During the summer of 2000, two temporary Butler Buildings were constructed on Hamilton Avenue; one to house the ambulances and the other to house Engine #2 and the Rescue Truck. In October 2000, the Department moved back to Hamilton Avenue and along with The Imken Wing which was still serviceable and

Engine #1. The three structures served the Department.

Due to the demolition of old Boro Hall and the construction of the new Public Safety Building, the Department subsequently had to move for a third time.

There was some discussion about locating the Department to the Honeywell Parking lot on Green Street in Teterboro (about 1.5 miles from Hamilton Avenue), but they eventually moved to the "Hershey Kiss" on Central Avenue on September 3, 2002.

The Department moved to its new Fire House at 248

The "Hershey Kiss," as it housed the Ladder Truck and Hamilton Avenue on October 2, 2004.

> The Hershey Kiss cost about \$210,000 plus utilities and was paid for by insurance.

> The Central Avenue space will now be used for Municipal Complex parking.

> The Butler Buildings cost about \$229,000 plus utilities and was paid for by insurance.

> The large Butler Building was moved to the DPW yard and the smaller Butler Building was given to the Lyndhurst Police Department.

# VFW Post -- 50 years of History

Ladies Auxiliary.

Helen was an Army nurse who served in the European Theater in World War II for two 1/2 years with the 250th Station Hospital.

Land for the Post was donated by the borough and the Post bought 4 lots for parking through personal loans which were paid for by 10 members.

The field artillery piece located in the front of the Post was acquired in 1963-1964 from the government. It is a 75 mm carriage gun M2A3 (SN/1471) that was made in 1941 by Parish Pressed Steel Company.

Additions to the building were made in about 1966 to include an office and storage. In 1983 a walk-in refrigerator was built. The coat room was added in 1976.

The stucco with gravel finish on the front was done in 1990 and the sides and back were done in 1992.



# VFW Membership

Post membership helps make vets aware of their entitlements. Any qualified veteran interested in joining should contact the Post for more information at 201-288-1112.

There are about 446 current members. Hackensack and Maywood closed their post and gave up their charter with some members transferring to the Post. Wood-Ridge and Carlstadt closed their Post but maintain their charter.

There are 44 VFW Posts in Bergen County and about 350 in New Jersey. There are about 55,000 members of the VFW in the state.

The post represents all services. VFW membership is available to all U.S. service members who have earned an overseas campaign, are currently on active-duty, and who have been honorably discharged from the U.S. armed forces. In addition, the service member must be a U.S. citizen.

Note: A 1995 VFW Congressional Charter amendment makes eligible all those who have served 30 consecutive days or 60 non-consecutive days on the Korean peninsula or in its territorial waters from June 30, 1949, until the present.

Post 4591 members have seen combat in WWI, WWII, Korea, Vietnam, Bosnia, Gulf War, Somalia, Beirut, Grenada, Panama, Cuban Blockade, Cold War to 1955, and Iraq.

During the Post history, just about every medal has been presented to the various VFW Post members -- and with oak leaf clusters representing multiple presentations. A partial list includes: The Silver Star, Bronze Star, Service Commendations, Campaign and occupation ribbons, Prisoner of War, Good Conduct, NJ Distinguished Service Medal, Purple Heart, etc.

The Purple Heart is awarded in the Name of the President to any member of the Armed Forces who, while serving was killed or wounded and required treatment by a medical officer.

In the 1950's, the Post Cooties visited Hasbrouck Heights Hospital and entertained disabled children. The Post Cooties have since disbanded.

The Post co-sponsors and chaperons class trips of Heights students to such places as the Intrepid Museum.

The Post sponsors the Voice of Democracy Essay Contest for the High School and the Youth Essay Contest for the Jr. High School.

The Post provides speakers for the schools in Hasbrouck Heights.

The Post sponsors teams for the Little League, Babe Ruth and Midget football teams.

Post 4591 donated a bullet proof vest to the Hasbrouck Heights Police Department.


The Post has donated to the Hasbrouck Heights Fire Department gel blankets for burn victims and towards the thermal imaging camera.

The gun is a French design Model 1897M that was used for many years. It was used in WWI by the US and the UK as well as the French. The carriage at the time was made of wooden spoke wheels and later replaced in WWII with steel and rubber wheels. Parish Steel Co. was the only manufacturer of the carriage which was called the M2A3.

It was built in 1941 and was mainly used in the Pacific. The gun was also mounted on Army half tracks as an anti-tank weapon. It appears that there are only two in existence. Special thanks to Oscar Hernandez for the info. ###



Other organizations that use this facility are the DVA (Disabled Veterans America Chapter 15) and the VVA (Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 800).

Other groups that use the facility include unions, church groups, Hasbrouck Heights Chamber of Commerce, etc.

The facility holds 250 people and is available for rental and catering for events.

### **Post Fund Raisers**

The Post hosts an Atlantic City trip on the last Wednesday of the month with profits helping defray the building expenses.

The Post also holds smokefree bingo every Thursday night from 7:30 to about 10 p.m. with all profits from this event going to support charitable activities.

Bingo was started in 1956 before the building was started and was held at Zimmerman's Hall in Carlstadt.

Currently about 75-80 attend, but over 10 years ago, the attendance was from 100-150.

### VFW History

The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States traces its roots back to 1899 when veterans of the Spanish-American War (1898) and the Philippine Insurrection (1899-1902) founded local organizations to secure rights and benefits for their service.

Many arrived home wounded or sick. There was no medical care or veterans' pension for them, and they were left to care for themselves.

In their misery, some of these veterans banded together and formed organizations with what would become known as the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

After chapters were formed in Ohio, Colorado and

Pennsylvania, the movement quickly gained momentum.

By 1915, membership grew to 5,000; by 1936, membership was almost 200,000.

# National Membership

The membership includes veterans from all wars and active-duty service members who have been involved in expeditionary campaigns.

Historically, membership roll call has included notable veterans like Alvin York, Audie Murphy, Carl Sandburg and John Glenn and eight U.S. Presidents including Theodore Roosevelt, Harry S. Truman, Dwight D. Eisenhower, John F. Kennedy, Lyndon B. Johnson, Richard M. Nixon, Gerald R. Ford and George Bush.

John F. Kennedy equated VFW with America's freedom and security. Whether on the battlefield or in the classroom, VFW members are there, everready to help those in need. ###

# **About the Pavers**

Engraved brick pavers with Veterans' names were placed in a Memorial Walkway in Veterans Park on Terrace & Passaic late April 2003. About 120 bricks were engraved and integrated into the walkway surrounding the Memorial Stone, and as of December 31, 2004, there are about 200 with more on order.

Bricks are available to all veterans from all services. To participate, it is not necessary for the veteran to be a member of the VFW or American Legion, nor be a deceased veteran. 
