Daisy Troop 1180 Tours New Municipal Complex

On Tuesday, April 19, Daisy Troop 1180 toured the new Municipal Complex located at 320 Boulevard. The tour of the first floor and basement was conducted by Michael J. Kronyak, Borough Administrator, and the third floor Hasbrouck Heights Free Public Library tour was conducted by Children's Librarian

Rosalie Nickles.

The tour began in front of the Borough Clerk's and Administrator's Offices where Mike welcomed the Daisies. He then led them to the Tax Collector's Offices where he showed them where the tax records are kept. Mr. Kronyak then pulled the record of one of the Daisies homes and explained what information the Borough collects on each piece of real estate located in the Borough. He then showed them the Tax Assessor's Office and then took the children into the Mayor's Office where he allowed them to sit in the Mayor's Chair.

Mr. Kronyak showed them the employee kitchen area,

where they promptly looked to see what was in the refrigerator. He then led them to the Senior Center which was being used and to the Building and Health Department's Offices.

Mike concluded the tour of the first floor at the Mayor and Council Chambers. Here he explained how municipal government works. He let them go up and sit in the Mayor and Council chairs — then explained what the Mayor and Council does during their public meetings.

Mr. Kronyak then took the Daisies down into the basement where he showed them the youth center, community room and the building utilities.



American Legion

James B. Scarr Post 106

Part One of a series about our American Legion.

Before the Post Began

James Bernard Scarr was born in Hollis, Kansas on February 17, 1893. After a number of moves, his family, including his younger brother Francis, settled on Columbus Avenue in Hasbrouck Heights in 1910.

James attended Rutgers

University after high school where he was active as a member of the Glee Club and held a number of class offices.

In addition to these activities, James was Captain of the Cadet Corps and participated in the Reserve Officers Training Corps since its inception in the summer of 1913.

After graduation from Rutgers, 'Jimmie' Scarr worked as a teacher and athletic director at Hasbrouck Heights High School during the 1916-17 year. He was also very active in the Scout movement and served as its second Scout Master.

America's declaration of war against Germany in April 1917 spurred James Scarr to take the examination for appointment to the rank of provisional Second Lieutenant in the Regular Army.

After passing the exam, James Scarr left his position at the High School and left for

The Hasbrouck Heights Fire Department conducted its Annual Inspection at 7:00 p.m. on Saturday, May 14, 2005.

Officers Training Camp at Fort Meyer VA in May of 1917.

Second Lieutenant James Scarr was commissioned in August 1917 and assigned to the 30th US Infantry Third Division in early September.

Rapidly promoted to First Lieutenant, James Scarr proceeded to France in February 1918 in advance of the rest of the Third Division.

The Third Division continued its training in France until being moved to the front at Chateau-Thierry on May 31, 1918 to stem the German assault on the French line at the Marne.

Lieutenant James Scarr was at the Battalion Headquarters in Mt. St. Bonneil on the evening of June 6, 1918.

The Headquarters was under heavy bombardment, and Lieutenant James Scarr was administering First Aid to three wounded men who had just been brought in when a high-explosive shell exploded nearby. Lieutenant James Scarr was killed instantly, his broken watch marking the exact time of his death, 2:15 a.m.

He was posthumously promoted to Captain. ####



Is it for a long-term purpose, or a short-term purpose?

If the money is to be spent on something that will last a long time, like a roof or a car, an equity loan might be better. If the money is to be spent on something that won't last long, like a semester in college or a wedding and reception, think about getting an equity line of credit.

Does a variable rate bother me?

A home equity line of credit has an adjustable rate that most likely changes every time the Federal Reserve raises or drops the federal funds rate. If you don't like the idea of having a rate that could rise every time the Fed meets, consider getting a home equity loan, which has a fixed rate.

How big of a monthly payment can I handle?

A home equity loan requires you to pay principal and interest every month for the life of the loan. A home equity line of credit allows you to pay just the interest for several years, if that's what you want to do. It's a whole other question whether it's a good idea to pay only the interest, and not the principal, for a long time.

Would a line of credit tempt me to use the money carelessly?

Naturally, if you answer this in the affirmative, you should consider getting a home equity loan, because you pay off the principal and interest over time and it's not a revolving credit account.####

Child Restraint Law

The Hasbrouck Heights Police Department reminds residents of New Jersey's Child Restraint Law.

Children under 18 months of age must be in a federally approved car seat when riding anywhere in a car.

Children between 18 months and five years old must be in a car seat if they are riding in the front seat and must be secured by a safety belt if riding in the rear seat.

If the number of children under five years old exceeds the number of safety belts, children who are not restrained must ride in the rear seat.

The penalty for violations of this law ranges from a \$10 to a \$25 fine. ####

Buckle Up

The Hasbrouck Heights Police Department reminds residents of New Jersey's Safety Belt Law.

Safety belts improve your chances of surviving a crash by 60%. Most crashes occur within 25 miles of home and at speeds of under 40 miles per hour.

NJ Law requires that all front seat occupants of a passenger vehicle must wear a safety belt system.

The driver is responsible for any passenger under the age of 18. Front seat passengers 18 and over are responsible for themselves.

The penalty for an unbelted front seat occupant is \$20.

The exemptions to this law include: those riding in a passenger auto manufactured before July 1, 1966 and those with physical or medical reasons verified in writing by a licensed physician. ####

Dog License due--\$20 Late Fee Applies

2005 dog license renewal was due by January 31, 2005. A \$20 late fee will be assessed effective June 1.

Failure to renew a license will result in legal action.

What's up with megapixels?

Knowing which megapixel camera to buy can be intimidating. There are literally hundreds of models of digital cameras out on the market today. How can you know how many megapixels you'll need?

For the most part, I would suggest that you get the highest megapixel rated digital camera you can afford.

Having said that though, there are some things you need to keep in mind before you make your next digital camera purchase.

What are megapixels anyway?

Simply put, megapixels refers to how many millions of pixels (picture elements = "dots") make up the images a particular camera takes.

The more pixels in the image, the more detail the camera can capture. More detail means better quality and better photos.

The higher the megapixels, the larger the photograph that can be produced and still be photo quality.

How many megapixels do you need?

Over the last few years, the cost of digital cameras has gone down considerably.

In the past, you had to pay big bucks for anything above 2 megapixels.

Today, I wouldn't recommend you buy anything under 4 megapixels if you have any intentions of getting professional prints done from the pictures you take: 4 megapixel cameras allow you to achieve excellent photo quality for any picture size up to 8x10.

For most people, this is the largest picture size they would ever get printed. Larger prints can certainly be made from a 4 megapixel camera, and are acceptable.

Is there any downside to lots of megapixels?

Only a small one. High megapixel cameras use up lots of memory. When each picture you take uses lots of memory, it means you fit less pictures on your camera for the same amount of memory.

If you have a 3 megapixel camera, you should be able to fit up to 40 pictures on 32mb of RAM.

If you have a 6 megapixel camera, for that same 32mb, you'll only be able to fit 20 pic-

The cost of memory has also gone down drastically. Memory card space is not the consideration it would have been in the past.

One aspect to consider is the type of memory your camera will accept. Most professionals use cameras that will accept "compact flash cards." Larger capacity compact flash cards are becoming available at an excellent price.

In the end, the more megapixels your camera can capture per image, the more options you have.

The teacher helped the students to organize a care package of DVD's, snacks and letters from the class.



HHFD Trains in Live Fire and Heavy Smoke Conditions

On a rainy Saturday moming, April 30, 2005, at 7:00 a.m., members of the Hasbrouck Heights Fire Department went "out of service" to conduct "live fire training" at the Middletown Township Volunteer Fire Department Training Academy.

The community's coverage was augmented by the Wood-Ridge Fire Department, until the HHFD returned at 3:00 p.m.

About a third of the department participated and traveled to the Academy with Engine #2, Rescue, EMS #2 and the Second Assistant Chief's SUV.

Once on location, the department connected to a hydrant, set up hoses, put on turnout gear and prepared the necessary equipment.

Middletown Academy trainers provided a "walk through" orientation of the smokehouse. The Academy burns Class "A" materials in the smokehouse to provide as close to realistic environment as possible to train firefighters for real-life, high temperature fires in smoke-filled environments.

The concrete block smokehouse facilitates multiple companies working together under both light and heavy smoke and fire conditions—and has two sections with a bi-level single family dwelling mockup on one side, and a split ranch single family dwelling on the other side—both full basement, plus a garage with automobile.

Training focused on establishing command, setting up multiple teams, putting out fires, search & rescue, etc. During the day-long drill, trainers set several fires in rapid succession. As soon as one fire was

extinguished, another was set. Occasionally, several fires were going at the same time.

Senior firefighters got practice performing the "command" position. All firefighters rotated on one of two teams — for search and rescue and to extinguish the blaze.

Senior department members critiqued each session and offered operational tips for better safety and performance. Middletown trainers would take Heights firefighters back into the structure to review specifics.

Trainers closely monitored each firefighter during each exercise, to insure personal safety, that correct procedures were executed, and that training objectives were being met.

Probationary and junior department members in red helmets were not permitted in the burning building, but got lots of support experience by replacing firefighters' Scott Air Packs on the fly, dragging hoses, getting tools, etc. Junior members were allowed to tour inside the structure after all fires were extinguished.

The training was so active, that the HHFD consumed its inventory of the compressed air used in the Scott Air Packs. The Academy re-charged the air tanks so that the training could continue.

The Middletown Fire Academy is certified by the NJ Division of Fire Safety, and provides comprehensive firematic training for firefighters in New Jersey.

Middletown Township Fire Department is the world's largest volunteer fire department with 11 companies and about 600 volunteers. ###



This collection of Britains was assembled over many years by local resident Martin Saccomano.

His fascination for these figures became a lifetime hobby for him. He has collected hundreds of figures and proudly displayed them at the Library.

Tov soldiers were first mass produced in Germany in the early 1700's.

These were flat and made of pewter. The first mass-produced three-dimensional lead soldiers were made in France in the late 1700's.

In the late 1800's manufacturers began producing less expensive, hollow lead soldiers.

Lead soldiers remained popular until the fear of lead poisoning became a concern in the early twentieth century.

Eventually lead was replaced by plastic which is cheaper and safer.

However, collectible miniature soldiers today are made of lead or other alloys.

William Britain Jr. (1860-1933) created his lead-free pewter miniature soldiers in 1893. Pewter consists of any of numerous silver-gray alloys of tin with various amounts of antimony, copper and sometimes lead.



A Visit to Tuscany Touch And A Taste of Italy

When Italian immigrants came to this country, they not only brought their hopes and dreams, but their cuisine as well. Many ingredients from the 'old country' were simply not available at the time, so they made do with products they found here.

With a large immigration from the Southern part of Italy, people brought the foods they knew and adapted them to their new surroundings. Over time, this became the basis for what we know as "Italian-American" cuisine.

A little piece of Italy arrived in Hasbrouck Heights when the Tuscany Touch opened on the Boulevard. The location has had many incarnations before known as Dolly's, Gramps, Kristine's Corner and most recently. Terra Nostra.

New owners, Michael and Regina D'Angelo opened the restaurant, celebrating its one year anniversary, on March 10, 2005. The D'Angelo's were living in Wood-Ridge at the time when they discovered the

business for sale.

With the opening of their new restaurant, the D'Angelo's also became our neighbors, moving to Hasbrouck Heights to be closer to the business. "We wanted to make a real investment in the town," Michael

The D'Angelo's have a colorful story in their start in the United States. Michael had immigrated to this country from Palermo, Sicily in 1982. He left in 1995 to go back to Italy to spend time with his family there.

While working as a chef at the, a 700 year villa in Florence, he met his wife, Regina Branchetti, a college student studying physiology. After they were married, Michael went to work at the house of the noble family, the Antinon's, who are famous all over the world for their wines.

He was introduced to them by his mother-in-law, who at the time was a chef for the family. As a private chef, he cooked special dishes for the guests of the Antinori's, who were there for wine tasting. It was a menu



of dishes to pair with the wines they were producing in the family vineyards.

Michael came back to this country in 2000 with his wife and their daughter.

Regina added, "We wanted more opportunities also for our daughter. In this country, there is more room for advancement and higher education." Their daughter, Valentina, now attends Hasbrouck Heights High

Michael said he wanted to develop a menu that would please customers. His traditional Italian menu contains such items as stuffed shells, eggplant and chicken parmigiana, spaghetti and meatballs and baked penne. His regular menu includes traditional items -- hamburgers, chicken wings, hot and cold sandwiches and salad platters.

His pizza menu is by the slice as well as personal, Sicilian and stuffed pizza. There are all sorts of calzones and bread rolls.

The chalkboard specials make Tuscany Touch unique. "We change our chalkboard specials everyday. We make all our own sauce and pastas from scratch and all of our specials are based on dishes I used to cook in Italy," Michael said. 'True Italian food is very creative."

In Italy, a person knows all the detailed ingredients behind the dish. All dishes are a product of their region based on the fresh ingredients available." Michael finds that the customers can taste the difference. "If you let them taste authentic food, they will know how it differs from restaurants here.

At our restaurant, we use fresh rosemary and sage as well as homemade pasta and fresh vegetables. We want our customers to taste the quality difference in our food. We try to be innovative with our cooking."

Some of the daily specials on the chalkboard are for appetizers, Fresh Tomato & Mozzarella and Breaded Mushrooms. For entrees, the restau-Chicken features Sorrentino, Chicken Calabrese and Gnocchi Caprese.

Pasta dishes, Tortellini Bolognese, Paglia e Tiera Pomadora and Lasagna

For dessert, Regina makes homemade Tiramisu and Almond Cake as well as Cannolli with fresh cream. "The difference in the way we prepare our meals and the way others cook is that we follow the traditional recipes of Italv.

When we make Penne a la Vodka, we use real vodka and bacon instead of a tomato cream sauce that others might use."

The restaurant is strictly BYOB but they do carry an array of sodas and teas. They will also do catering for large parties.

In the summer, Michael grows his own basil, oregano, parsley, eggplant, zucchini and tomatoes to use in the restaurant. "The fresh ingredients really make a difference in the flavor of the food. Even when I use garlic, I use it from the bulb and cut it to order. I don't like the peeled garlic in the plastic containers."

Since they moved to Hasbrouck Heights, the D'Angelo family has established a warm, friendly atmosphere. "Customers like a family restaurant where the husband and wife cook side by side. We think of our food as inventive and creative," Michael says. Regina included, "We have a lot of trust from our customers."

Mike and Regina thank all their loyal customers from Hasbrouck Heights and Wood -Ridge who continue to eat here and would like to extend a welcome to new patrons to come in and try their restaurant. ###






