

# Daisy Troop 612 Tours the New Police Facility

On the afternoon of January 24, 2005, Daisy Troop 612 toured the new 32,000 square foot, Hasbrouck Heights Police Department at 248 Hamilton Avenue.

The police facility supports 32 police officers and 2 civilian employees.

The Troop gathered after school in the conference room located just off the main entrance.

The tour was led by D.A.R.E Lieutenant Shawn Mullins who opened the door to this secure facility and took the Daisies to the area where

officers have access to two computers to write reports or check their individual mail box.

The next stop was the Records Room where Lt. Mullins explained the function of the Police Department Records Room.

Patrons seeking records such as an accident report speak through a bullet proof window with a speaker.

The third stop was "sally port" which is a secured garage located between the Police and Fire Departments.

Here an arresting officer can drive his suspect into the

building. Once inside, the garage door automatically closes and the room is secured. This minimizes the opportunity for a suspect to escape during transfer.

Once inside, the officer must put his weapon in a special locker before the suspect is taken from the vehicle.

A large window allows the main desk to view all activities.

One of the seven radio cars was positioned in the garage and Lt. Mullins gave the scouts a tour of the vehicle and its complement of sophisticated computer and communications

gear.

He also explained that patrol cars are mobile police stations that are equipped with radar, video camera, first aid kit, flares, fire extinguisher, HAZMAT suit, oxygen and defibrillator.

The young ladies were permitted to sit in the vehicle, but to their disappointment, could not turn on the siren.

The tour advanced past special benches with hand-cuffs, near the fingerprinting and mug-shot area.

Lt. James Krisinski and Det. Sgt. Joseph Rinke took their fingerprints and mug shots and gave them as souvenirs.

After washing their hands from the fingerprint ink, the Daisies passed through a door into a short hallway -- with two state-of-the-art holding cells.

Lt. Mullins called to their attention, that at the doors entrance, there was a special "hot button" that alerts the department of emergencies.

These prefabricated self contained cells were installed during the construction of the building.






# **Euclid School Holds Science Fair**

### **Daisies Tour New HHPD Facility**

Each cell has a solid steel door with observation holes and special drawer to pass through food trays. This minimizes the contact between the officer and the prisoner.

The cells are equipped with video and audio direct to the police desk officer who can observe the suspect at all times.

Lt. Mullins led the ladies inside one of the cells and detailed several items to include a camera, fire suppression system, a phone (calls are paid for by the suspect), etc.

A special stairway near the holding cell area can privately and securely take prisoners to the court holding area upstairs.

From the holding cell area, Lt. Mullins took the Daisies to one of the two interrogation rooms and called to their attention the one-way mirror where observers can watch the interview. He also noted the breathalyzer unit on the table.

The next stop on the tour was the main desk area.

Here the desk sergeant sits at the central command center.

From this position, the officer can view people entering the main door through a bulletproof window. Public to main desk communication is via a speaker system and material must pass through a special window box.

The desk officer can also view the "sally port" through a window.

This command center has access to about 16 video surveillance cameras inside and outside the buildings as well as the Municipal Complex at 320 Boulevard. This capability will soon be able to access the surveillance cameras located at the Hasbrouck Heights High School.

At the desk sergeant's finger tips is an array of electronic and communication equipment.

The traditional phone has been replaced with a mouse and head set. Caller ID tells the officer the location of the call. 911 is served at this location.

The Department is connected to the NCIC (the National Crime Information Center).

The state of the art radio system allows the desk officer to communicate with HH Police and Fire Departments as well as communication with surrounding jurisdictions utilizing the Bergen County Alert System and the NJ State Police Emergency System (SPEN).

Additional capabilities at the main desk include: the ability for the desk officer to instant message directly to each patrol vehicle in Hasbrouck Heights as well as patrol vehicles in other

After inspecting the command center, the Daisies were led to the back of the building.

Lt. Mullins showed them the refrigerated evidence lockers which can hold blood and urine samples that are to be sent to the lab.

Across from the evidence lockers is the department's kitchen area -- where the "Daisies" promptly looked into the refrigerator.

Further down the hall was the secured weapons room.

Next to the weapons room is the conference room -- that has two one way mirrors that view the interrogation rooms.

Lt. Mullins led the Troop through various offices for the Chief, Captains, Detectives, D.A.R.E., etc.

He informed the Daisies that the basement area had the Continued on page 10

The Heights team earned 13 gold, 9 silver and 6 bronze medals.



# **AHOF Celebrates Black History Month**

A special exhibit of New Jersey African-American aviation men and women who have achieved recognition for their accomplishments is now on display in the New Jersey Aviation Hall of Fame & Museum at Teterboro Airport.

Some of those pioneers include Dr. Albert Forsythe of Atlantic City who with Alfred Anderson, became the first African-Americans to fly coast-to-coast in 1933 and the first to fly to various Caribbean Islands a year later.

Jersey City's Barbara Hebron was the first African-American to become an Airport Duty Manager at Newark Liberty International Airport.

When James Plinton was named the Vice President of Eastern Airlines in 1957, the Westfield native became the first African-American to hold a top executive position with a major airline.

On display are the pho-

tographs of a number of New Jerseyans who served with the Tuskegee Airmen during World War II.

During World War II, P-51 fighter planes were flown by African-American pilots in combat in North Africa, Italy and over Germany as bomber escorts.

The airmen took pride in the fact that they never lost a bomber they escorted against enemy aircraft.

The P-51s were distinctly painted with red tails and among the bomber crews and pilots the planes were known as the "Red Tail Angels."

The Germans called them "Schwartze Vogelmenschen" (Black Birdmen).

The majority of the Airmen pilots were trained at Tuskegee Institute in Alabama.







# HFD Responds to Teterboro Crash

On February 2, 2005, a twin-engine Challenger 600 skidded off the runway, through the fence, across Route 46 striking several cars before crashing into Strawberry clothing warehouse.

First Assistant Chief Angelo Roccamo was driving on Hamilton Avenue near the firehouse when the fire dispatch channel screamed "99 to Heights ... 99 to Heights" (99 is the fire command for Teterboro Operations).

He answered, "61 to 99 ... go ahead." The message was "plane fire Route 46 West." Then the tones went in from Headquarters.

7:20 a.m. Beep. Beep. Beep. The call goes out for the Hasbrouck Heights Fire Department to respond to Teterboro Airport, the message was, "We have a plane fire at the airport."

Fresh brewed coffee will have to wait; warm bed covers are pulled back; newspapers are put down; chores are stopped as the activities of about 25 men and women turn to responding to the call.

7:23 a.m. First Assistant Chief Angelo Roccamo arrived on the scene and assumed command. Roccamo said, "As I was approaching the scene, I saw

the plume of dark smoke, so I knew we had a problem."

He then saw a large aircraft afire and protruding from the Strawberry clothing warehouse which employs about

Roccamo gives the order for second alarm.

7:24 a.m. The firehouse is activated as the team arrives from all over town. Turn-out gear is put on. The giant doors are opened. Trucks are started.

7:26 a.m. Engine One is the first vehicle to depart quickly going down Hamilton to Franklin, across Route 17, the railroad tracks, left onto Industrial Avenue, then right down

7:27 a.m. Engine Two departs followed in quick succession with the Ladder company, Rescue squad and both EMS

7:30 a.m. The house is

empty and the department is rolling.

7:32 a.m. Second Assistant Chief Michael Ratkowski arrived on the scene at Route 46 and found several motorists, Port Authority employees and Strawberry warehouse employees helping the injured to safety.

One car was strewn on Route 46 with injured.

The air was heavy with jetfuel fumes.

The Port Authority fire truck was first on the scene and was pumping foam onto the smoking plane.

Because of the Huyler Street address, the Little Ferry Fire Department was dispatched and responded before Hasbrouck Heights.

Little Ferry Fire Department and EMS rescue workers rushed to the mangled car hit by the plane and, using the "Jaws of Life" hydraulic cutter, pulled out the driver and pas-

First responders from the area begin to assemble. Due to the extensive pre-planning and training -- our area resources came together as a team.

Police from Little Ferry and Moonachie, as well as Port Authority, NJ State and Bergen County Police and Sheriff's officers, closed Route 46 from Huyler Street to Industrial Avenue, set up detours and secured the scene from onlookers and reporters and to preserve potential evidence for **National Transportation Safety** Board investigators.

Fire Departments from Hackensack, Lodi, Moonachie, Saddle Brook and Wallington and Wood-Ridge assisted.

Roccamo assessed the situation and began to position the departments' resources.

7:40 a.m. Heights Engines One and Two faced the plane and were positioned on Route 46 Westbound. EngineTwo hand stretched 5" hose back to the hydrant, and fed Engine #1 which began pumping water.

The Rescue truck ran "Communications" in the Eastbound lane of Route 46, in front of the crash site, behind Engine

Heights Ladder truck was positioned at the west side of Strawberry's to back up roof operations and assist Little Ferry's Ladder already working on the roof.

Their job was to perform ventilation operations to clear the smoke out of the warehouse, so firefighters inside could perform successful search & rescue as well as extinguish any

Heights EMS was set up at the center of Route 46 for triage.

7:50 a.m. Little Ferry sets up a second back-up triage center in the gymnasium of 700 student Bergen Technical High School -- 250 yards next to the warehouse to assist Heights EMS.

Seriously injured were the

pilot, co-pilot, and two passengers in the car that was struck on Route 46. Five firefighters sustained minor injuries.

Hackensack Medical Center and Holy Name Hospital were put on alert to handle casualties.

At the hospitals, many of the passengers underwent decontamination for jet-fuel exposure. They were directed to heated tents where they were showered and given hospital gowns to wear.

8:00 a.m. Units from East Rutherford, Carlstadt, Garfield and Rutherford were positioned at the Hasbrouck Heights Fire Department to handle any other Hasbrouck Heights or Teterboro emergency.

**8:17 a.m**. The fire was declared under control.

8:30 a.m. The fires are put

**8:45 a.m.** They continue to vent the building of smoke.

**8:50 a.m**. With concerns of a roof collapse, air horns and sirens are sounded to evacuate the building.

9:00 a.m. A fire truck with a special piercing nozzle to puncture the fuselage, arrives from Newark Liberty International Airport and injects fire suppressing foam into the aircraft.

Throughout the early moments, Roccamo called in: Garfield's Mass Decontamination Unit, Bergen County HAZMAT, Lodi's Rehab Unit, Special Ops, PSE&G, United Water, DEP to contain the fuel spill, Teaneck's Box 54, etc.

Officials arrived from the FBI, NJ State Police, various Emergency Managements, BC

Prosecutor's Office, etc.

The Hasbrouck Heights Police Department assisted in handling traffic.

1:00 p.m. At the airport's administration building Roccamo participated in a press conference which was also attended by Acting Governor Richard Codey.

**4:50 p.m.** The Hasbrouck Heights Fire Department is released from the scene.

**10:45 p.m.** Route 46 was reopened to traffic.

Temporary walls were set up Wednesday evening to shield the scene from onlookers.

The Hasbrouck Heights Fire Department was on standby on the afternoon of Sunday, February 6 as the plane was removed by a crane and moved to a warehouse in Harrison, NJ on a flatbed truck. ###

### It's Not Just Heartworm Prevention Anymore ...

In past years heartworm prevention medication was given primarily in the warmer months of the year to protect our pets from heartworm disease.

Heartworm disease is a disease of both the lungs and the heart caused by roundworms that actually infect the right side of the heart which can lead to heart failure.

The adult heartworms can occasionally be dislodged from the heart and washed by the flowing blood into the lung fields causing severe pulmonary disease and the inability to exercise. Heartworms are transmitted by mosquitoes that suck blood containing "baby" heartworms (called microfilaria) from an infected dog and then bite a non-infected dog releasing the "baby" worms into that dog's body.

The first preventitive developed to protect dogs against heartworm disease was a pill that was required to be given daily which many pet owners found difficult to achieve.

Later the medication was formulated in a chewable form which made it easier to administer but still required daily dosing.

In recent years newer formulations have allowed the preventitives to be given once monthly making compliance much easier for the pet owner.

Please note that the monthly preventitive did not include 30 days of preventitive medication into one dose, but rather a different active ingredient was used to stop the microfilaria from developing into adult worms.

Today's formulations protect not only against heartworms but also against the common parasites of the gastrointestinal tract.

These parasites include roundworms, hookworms and whipworms all of which can eventually cause vomiting, diarrhea, and bloody stools if allowed to grow unchecked.

Thus we actually should refer to these medications as worm prevention not just heartworm prevention!

Because we use the medications to prevent gastrointestinal worms as well as heartworms, it is essential that they be given monthly all year long.

Many veterinarians recommend a yearly heartworm blood test and stool check followed by the year-round monthly use of chewable tablets for worm prevention.

There are other safe and effective products available, also given monthly, which protect your household against fleas as well as worms.

If you have any questions about parasite prevention please check with your veterinarian who knows your pet best and can make specific recommendations about parasite control best suited to your pet's needs





### Lenten Message

The word Lenten comes from the word "lencten" which means to lengthen, as the days start to become longer in Spring.

The Lenten season begins with Ash Wednesday and lasts 40 days.


Remember, it is always a thought before an action.






