He said that 20% of the Police Department has been hired in the last year and a half and he had asked back then what the plan was. Mayor Heck said she was available to speak any time during the week and in the Library meeting on Saturdays, why did he wait to bring this up at a public meeting. Mayor Heck explained that whenever there are retirements, a list is needed of the top people to replace them. She advised him that if he wants to know about personnel, he can ask Police Commissioner DiPisa, Deputy Commissioner Gonzalez or Chief Colaneri. He asked how many people knew about this test before Friday. Mayor Held told him, herself, who asked for the test, Councilman DiPisa, Councilman Gonzalez who said it was actually his idea; with Councilwoman Buckman, Lipari and Link saying they did not. Councilman DiPisa said personnel changes daily. Councilman Semenecz asked how many were being replaced. Mayor Heck said five new officers were hired from the old list.

Mayor Heck requested a motion to approve the foregoing resolution which was made by Councilman DiPisa, seconded by Councilman Gonzalez, with Councilman Semenecz voting No, and otherwise unanimously carried.
